

Hello fellow anglers,

I hope everyone is enjoying the fall season with the comfortable weather and beautiful mix of fall colors on the hillsides. The years do come guicker even if some of us are in denial.

Looking back on the 2025 season it was one that saw high participation and decent results for registered tyee. Registration numbers were higher than in 2024. The weather cooperated mostly except for a few windy evenings that kept most boats on the wharf.

The most significant project this summer was having the Tyee Club wharf ramp modified in early August with the addition of a user-friendly handrail to allow safe access to and from the wharf. A non-slip transition piece from the walkway to the wharf was also added. With the purchase of a wheeled wagon for safe transport of heavy or bulkier loads, access to and from the wharf will be much safer and easier for all wharf users.

Security cameras were also installed at the wharf that provide 24-hour surveillance of the wharf to assist in security. Next year, an additional camera will be linked to the clubhouse which will give the weighmaster the ability to keep an eye on the wharf from time to time during the quiet periods of the day.

The total registered number of Tyee this year was 12. Five of the registered tyee were caught by new members. Two of the registered fish were rowed by rookie rowers.
